Bios

Rick Sterling is an investigative journalist based in the San Francisco Bay Area. He is active with the <u>Taskforce on the Americas</u> and other organizations including <u>Syrian Solidarity Movement</u> and the <u>Mount Diablo Peace and Justice Center</u>. Rick has researched and written articles <u>challenging the trend</u> toward corporatization of higher education. He is an active supporter of <u>KPFA</u> (listener sponsored radio) and Rossmoor Voices for Justice in Palestine. Rick was a full-time activist in his early years, had a 25-year detour working as an engineer in the electronics and aerospace industries, primarily at UC Berkeley, and has now returned to work full time where his heart is: progressive international causes.

Rev. Silvia Antonia Brandon-Pérez is one of EPI's board members. Silvia is Cuban born, a multilingual translator, author and an ordained Catholic priest who provides paralegal services for people who can't afford it. She also runs a Catholic Worker House from her home in Hayward, CA, that provides temporary shelter, showers, food and even clothing for people down on their luck, called the Oscar Romero and Simone Weil Catholic Worker House.

Pierre Labossiere is Co-Founder of the Haiti Action Committee (HAC) and the Haiti Emergency Relief Fund (HERF) established in the Bay Area in 1991 and 2004 respectively. Working with Haiti's grassroots movement that is engaged in the struggle for justice and democracy, HAC and HERF provide information regarding conditions on the ground, assist refugees and support community-based initiatives and institutions working for the liberation and the rebuilding of Haiti.
